This course teaches medical terminology, human anatomy, and reliable methods for retaining the material. Participants will review the structure and composition of the human body and organ functions while learning helpful methods for breaking down medical terms and word meaning. By reviewing word structure, visual identification of terms, spelling, definition, and pronunciations, participants will be able to better grasp the terms for application in medical coding.

Flash cards and CD-ROM practice will enhance your comprehension of complex medical terms.

AAPC Professional Medical Coding Curriculum

ZHTH 1175

Prerequisite: Medical Terminology/Anatomy & Physiology

The course curriculum from the American Academy of Professional Coders is presented in a 22-chapter format. Chapters include medical terminology, anatomy overviews, with CPT and ICD-9-CM coding issues, organized in a way that is consistent with the most current American Medical Association's Physician Current Procedural Terminology. The course also includes end-of-chapter review questions to enhance comprehension of the material covered. Students may choose to achieve CPC certification upon successful completion of the Academy's Professional Medical Coding Curriculum (PMCC).

Certified Medical Coder (CMC) by PMI

Prerequisite: Medical coding experience or prior coding seminars

Topics will include: analysis of claim information versus medical record documentation; audit tools based on the OIG workplan, and what to look for in audits.
